FIFTY-SEVEN SENIORS TO BE GRADUATED FROM RAMAZ THIS WEEK Class of 1968 Establishes Outstanding Record

The graduating class of 1968 of Ramaz High School will be graduated at exercises this coming Thursday evening. The class has established an outstanding record which matches and surpasses some of the best classes in the history of Ramaz.

Out of the 53 students who were eligible to take the Regents Scholarship exam of the State of New York, 35 seniors will be the recipients of scholarships.

The class has won for itself many honors and distinctions. One of the members of the class was a finalist in the National Merit Scholarship Contest, while 14 of his fellow-students earned letters of commendation. One member of the class was a winner in the National Honor Society competition, while another was a semi-finalist. In addition, 2 students were cited by the Governor's Committee on scholarship achievement, 2 students were awarded prizes by the Mathematics Association of America and several other students were recipients of other awards.
