## JEWRY DUTY PARTICIPANTS INCREASE DURING PAST YEAR

Fourteen years ago Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun initiated a program known as "Jewry Duty." During that time, more and more members of the congregation have joined the ranks of those who support the daily minyan by their personal participation.

It is heartening to report that more than one hundred and thirty members of our congregational family obligated themselves to attend at least one full week of morning services during last year. This is the highest figure reached in the history of this program. We are proud of the awareness on the part of our membership of the importance of daily worship.

As a result of the dedication of our "Jewrors," the daily minyan functioned on a sound basis. Many members of the congregation were introduced to the practice of regular daily worship,

because of the call to "Jewry Duty" which they received.

The Kehilath Jeshurun Jewrors performed a service for themselves and for the congregation. Unbeknown to them, however, they performed a service to the larger Jewish community throughout the country. We continue to receive requests from orthodox synagogues inquiring on how best to establish a Jewry Duty program. Many synagogues have already taken our model program and have introduced it with similar success into their religious services.

We hope that next year, members of our congregation who have not as yet taken the opportunity to become part of Jewry Duty, will feel it a personal obligation to serve their congregation and simultaneously derive spiritual benefit in the support of this vital program.
