#### FOUR HUNDRED MEALS SERVED IN SYNAGOGUE SUKKAH

Four hundred diners availed themselves of the Synagogue Sukkah during the holiday just passed. Among them were some seventy-five children who added youthful exuberance to the Sukkah meals and who brightened the holiday with their repertoire of religious songs as well as Israeli melodies.

In addition to the regular diners, the Sukkah served kiddush to all of our worshippers following every occasion of public worship. There was no count made, but it is safe to assume that more than a thousand made kiddush in the Sukkah.

The attendance was so gratifying that serious thought is being given to build an additional Sukkah atop the roof of the school building. Should this eventualize, we will be the first congregation with two Sukkoth on its premises.

#### "B'reshit" LEARNING EVOLUTION FROM THE TORAH

The opening portion of the Torah is known by students of the Bible and non-students of the Bible as the portion which contains the description of the creation of the world. Funda-mentalists over thousands of years have fought for a literal interpretation of this description and rejected, as atheistic, the theories of science on the question. Sceptics, on the other hand, have embraced the principles of evolution and have repudiated the authenticity of the Torah because of what they considered to be its naive and inaccurate description of the origin of life on this planet.

It is interesting to note that Rashi, perhaps the greatest of the mediaeval commentators who shed light on scripture, regards as absurd the notion that the Torah is concerned with the description of the origin of life on earth in an orderly fashion. According to this view, the fundamentalist is fighting in vain, for he is ignorant of the very fundamentals of the text which allegedly he strives to preserve. The sceptic, on the other hand, in Rashi's view, has merely set up a straw-man which he can then bowl over with scientific evidence. In reality, the Torah is not disproved by science because the Torah never enters the domain of science.

Our classical English translation of the opening verse of Genesis reads as follows: "In the beginning God created Heaven and Earth", Rashi rejects this translation as erroneous because of a glaring grammatical error on the word "B'reshit" which means not "In the Beginning" but rather "In the Beginning of." He would translate the verse in this fashion:

"In the beginning of God's creation of Heaven and Earth, the earth was unformed and void . . .".

It is noteworthy that this translation of Rashi was chosen as the opening words of the new Torah translation by The Jewish Publication Society, which appeared some six years ago. At least in this aspect, the new translation was not really new; it was re-newed. This is one of its strongest recommendations.

Rashi's contribution, however, to our comprehension of scripture is simply that the Torah was concerned not so much with the order of creation, but

rather with the fact that God was the Creator.

This is the traditional outlook toward Torah. The Torah is not a scientific book, nor is it a volume of history. It is a book reflecting God's will concerning man's actions. It is a book designed to lead man to ethical performance. In order to set the stage for the ethical imperatives in the Torah, God found it necessary to include an introductory section dealing with the general theme of His creation of the world and the creation of man in the image of God.

The introduction is there exclusively for its ethical significance. It should be judged only on that basis and not for the accuracy of its scientific judgments which are not intended to be scientific and which are stated in the most general way, purely for their value as incentives for man's ethical conduct. Joseph Glatt was an active Religious Zionist throughout his life. He is now serving as Secretary of the New York Council of Religious Zionists of America. He absorbed the ideals of Zionism from his earliest youth and spent several years at a kibbutz in Israel. It was there that he met his wife and he and Tzvia were married in Israel.

His four children, Tzina, Yehuda, Elchanan and Nechama were all students at Ramaz and for a while his wife taught in the religious school of our congregation. He and his family were truly part of Kehilath Jeshurun.

Joseph Glatt served faithfully and efficiently not alone as Executive Director of the congregation but he also administered the affairs of our Men's Club and Sisterhood. He became the friend of every member of the congregation and is warmly regarded by everyone.

In Israel, Joseph Glatt will become the Administrator of the Israel Torah Research Institute which has a student body recruited from Israel and from many Western countries, including America. His residence will be in Bayit Vegan, a beautiful suburb of Jerusalem.

Kehilath Jeshurun bids him a fond farewell. It extends to him and to his entire lovely family the best wishes and blessings for a happy and fruitful stay in the Holy Land. We are confident that in his professional capacity, he will make a splendid contribution to the institutional life of Israel.

#### TO BEGIN NOV. 4th The 1968-69 season of the Kehilath Jeshurun Adult Institute will begin its sessions during the week of November 4th. You should be receiving the new brochure of the Adult In-

stitute within the next few days. In the meantime please be advised of the following courses, which will run during the first part of the year.

#### 1. THE TALMUD CLASS

Under the instruction of Rabbi Haskel Lookstein this class will resume its study of the tractate Pesachim, on Monday evening, November 4th, at 8:30 P.M. Sessions will then continue regularly through the month of June.

#### 2. STUDIES IN JUDAISM The Class for Women

This well-attended course will resume its sessions on Monday morning, November 4th, at 11:00 o'clock and will continue meeting weekly thereafter. The course is under the instruction of Rabbi Haskel Lookstein and it will be concerned this year with the general subject of Jewish Ethics. Among the topics to be discussed are: Holiness, Pride, Meekness, Truth, Charity, Vengeance and Parent-Child Relationships.

#### 3. ELEMENTARY HEBREW

This course, to be taught by Mrs. Charles Cohen, will meet regularly on Wednesday evenings from 8:00 to 9:00, beginning November 6th. It is designed for students who have no reading knowledge of Hebrew. Like the other courses, this offering is open to both men and women.

#### 4. **BIBLICAL LITERATURE**

This course will be conducted entirely in Hebrew. Taught by Rabbi Joshua Bakst, it will be concerned with selected themes from the Book of Genesis, relating to sibling rivalry. It will meet on the following Wednesday evenings from 8:00 to 9:00 P.M., November 6, 13, 20 and December 4, 11 and 18th.

#### 5. MAIMONIDES; BOOK OF REBELLION

This class will be held on the above Wednesday evenings from 9:00 to 10:00 P.M. under the instruction of Rabbi Haskel Lookstein. It will be concerned with the study of the Laws of Rebellion as recorded by Maimonides in the last book of his monumental code of law. Extensive selections from the code will be available in English translation.

#### AN EVERLASTING MEMORIAL

#### The Dedication of a Yahrzeit Plaque

We bring to the attention of our members and worshippers that in our Main Synagogue there are Memorial Tablets upon which may be inscribed the names of dear departed ones.

On these Tablets, each name is inscribed on an individual plaque which bears the name of the deceased and the date of the yahrzeit in Hebrew and in English. Memorial lights, are located on either side of the individual plaque. These lights are kindled on the yahrzeit and at every memorial service. On these occasions memorial prayers are recited for all those whose names are inscribed on the Tablets.

The dedication of a plaque in the House of God is a beautiful and appropriate memorial for a departed loved one.
