ISRAEL INDEPENDENCE SABBATH THIS WEEK

Special Prayers to be Recited in Honor of Israel and its Martyrs

The services in the synagogue this coming Saturday morning will bear a special character. They will reflect the fact that this Sabbath comes between two significant dates on the Jewish calendar: The Day of the Holocaust (Tuesday, April 15th) and Israel Independence Day (Wednesday, April 23rd).

As a result of the enthusiasm engendered by a Yeshiva University Sabbath here at the congregation, at the special Brunch which we conducted on the Sunday before our Y. U. Sabbath and at the Chanukah Dinner that was conducted by Yeshiva University in December, Kehilath Jeshurun members have pledged a total of more than \$155,000.00 toward the support of Yeshiva University.

It will be a source of particular pride to our readers to learn that this would appear to be the largest single sum pledged by members of any congregation throughout the country in support of America's greatest institution of Jewish and general learning.

Our congregation can be justifiably proud of its sons and daughters who contributed so generously at the Chanukah Dinner, at our own brunch and at the appeal which was conducted on Yeshiva University Sabbath. An unprecedented number of contributors indicated through their support their realization that Yeshiva University constitutes the bedrock of Jewish life in America.

Once again, Kehilath Jeshurun leads the way in demonstrating the order of priorities for Jewish philanthropy in this land. We hope that other congregations and groups will demonstrate similar concern and support for those institutions that provide the best insurance for Jewish survival and growth.

RABBI HASKEL LOOKSTEIN ON T.V. THIS SUNDAY MORNING

In honor of the forthcoming Israel Independence Day, a special half-hour T.V. program will be shown this Sunday morning at 9:30 o'clock on the Jewish Heritage show, WNBC-T.V., Channel 4.

Rabbi Haskel Lookstein is the moderator of the program which will feature five young Israeli artists performing in dance and in vocal and violin recitals. The program is under the sponsorship of the New York Board of Rabbis and the America-Israel Culture Foundation.

FROM THE BOOKSHELF

A JERUSALEM MEMOIR

(The following is excerpted from the remarks of General Hayyim Herzog at a symposium held in Tel Aviv on July 27, 1967. The proceedings have been published in a booklet called, "Jerusalem My Chiefest Joy" under the auspices of the Forum for Jewish Thought, Tel Aviv, Israel. ed. note).

In comparison with other wars experienced by Jerusalem, the last was relatively brief. All in all it took less than two days from the moment the Forces began to move. Indeed, Jerusalem has passed through a great deal since King David conquered it from the Jebusites about three thousand years ago. It was occupied by the Egyptians in the days of Rehoboam the son of Solomon. It was besieged by Sennacherib of Assyria in the fourteenth year of King Hezekiah's reign. It was destroyed by Nebuchadnezzar. The Greeks took possession of it until it was liberated by the Maccabees. It was destroyed by the Romans in the year 70 C.E. It passed through Byzantine rule, it was conquered by the Persians in 614 C.E. and was then ruled by the Jews until the Christians conquered it again. It fell to the Arabs in 638. It fell once again before the Christians when the Crusaders assaulted it with 20,000 warriors and slaughtered all the inhabitants, Moslems and Jews alike. Crusader rule continued until the Moslems reconquered the City in 1187. After that Jerusalem was destroyed by the Mongol invaders, who were finally driven out by Mameluke Moslems from Egypt. They in turn continued to rule Jerusalem until 1516, when the Ottoman Turks under Sultan Selim conquered the Land of Israel including Jerusalem. The famous Sultan Suleiman the Magnificent surrounded Jerusalem with a new Wall, which is the Wall of our own days. And Ottoman rule continued until the year 1917, when the British entered the City of Jerusalem during the First World War.

In 1948, after the War of Independence, Jerusalem remained cleft in twain. The Western part became the capital of Israel while the Eastern part was held by the rulers of Jordan. This continued until 7th June 1967, when the Forces of Israel conquered the Eternal City and the Israel Government established the rule of Israel there; and there, we hope, it will remain until the End of Days.
