Two distinguished sons of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun were honored at the annual national dinner of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America held on May 18th, at the Americana Hotel.

Senator Albert Wald, a former member of the New York State Senate, was cited for his leadership in the U.O.J.C.A. and the Jewish community at large as he reached his eightieth birthday. Senator Wald has been a member of this congregation for decades. He served as the President of its Men's Club. In the community he is a former President of the Synagogue Council of America.

Our esteemed Trustee, Eugene Hollander, who is currently recuperating from illness, was presented in absentia with the U.O.J.C.A. President's Award. Cited as a man "who is an inspiring example of the quiet heroism which has made us survive as a people," Mr. Hollander was presented with a beautiful plaque in recognition of his service to this congregation, to Ramaz, to the wider Jewish community and to the U.O.J.C.A. which he serves as a member of its Board of Directors.

We wish both of these gentlemen a hearty Mazel Tov and we pray that they will continue to merit recognition and tribute for their communal service in the years to come.

COMMUNAL HONORS

We note with pride the presentation of an award to our esteemed member, Rabbi Isaac N. Trainin, at a special celebration conducted by the Yeshiva and Mesifita of Eastern Parkway, on the occasion of the replacing of Torah Scrolls lost in the fire which struck the Yeshiva last fall.
