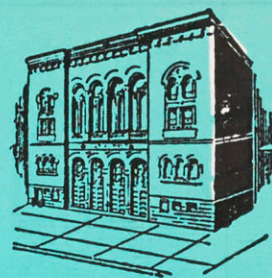

ABOUT OUR GUEST SPEAKER

Consul Joshua Pratt is the former First Secretary of the Israel Embassy in Moscow. He served in that capacity for three years, following two years of service with the Israel Embassy in Poland. He is generally acknowledged to be the most informed Jew in America on the status of Jewry in the Soviet Union, having visited many Jewish communities there during his tenure in office.

His particular field of endeavour in the Consulate of Israel is the area of Human Rights. Consul Pratt is a graduate of Tel-Aviv University and is the father of two Ramaz students.

We are very proud that a distinguished spokesman of the State of Israel and an informed student of Soviet Jewish affairs will address our congregation. There will be no sermon this Shabbat morning in order to allow sufficient time to hear the message of Consul Pratt.

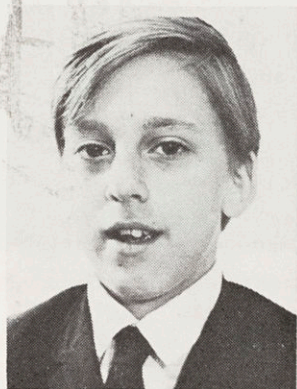

HEADLINES OF JEWISH INTEREST

Students Protest Lack of Funds for Soviet Effort.

On February 2nd, fifty college and high school students, calling themselves the Ad Hoc Committee to Revitalize the American Jewish Conscience on Soviet Jewry, picketed for an hour and a half outside the building containing the offices of the Conference of Presidents of Major American Jewish Organizations. They charged the leadership of the Conference with denying autonomy to the Conference on Soviet Jewry and refusing it the legal status required for fund raising. They protested that after seven years of existence, the Conference on Soviet Jewry had only one paid professional on its staff and that it was financially unable to mount a meaningful program of protests in behalf of three and a half million Soviet Jews.

Mobil Oil Company Yields to Arab Boycott

The Mobil Oil Company admitted yielding to the Arab boycott of Israel-made products in its Mid East operations. A spokesman for the company told the Jewish Telegraphic Agency that the firm had been forced to take that action because all tankers entering Libyan ports are searched. Discovery of any products made or grown in Israel brings stiff fines to the owner of the ship or its seizure by Libyan authorities.

Recently, the Libyan Government added to the banned list of products, Jaffa orange juice, canned in Norway or Canada as well as several other non-Israeli products — Brazilian beer, Trinidad orange juice and Swedish matches — for the reason that these products have six-pointed symbols on their labels, which vaguely resemble the Star of David. The Mobil spokesman admitted the company's compliance with these additional restrictions.
