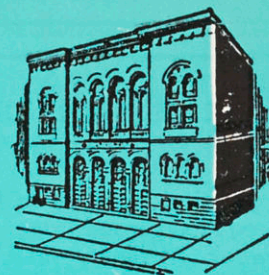

PURIM NOTES FOR PARENTS AND CHILDREN

Here are some matters that should be born in mind in connection with the forthcoming Purim festival:

On Wednesday night, March 10th, Mincha services will be held at 5:30 in the Chapel of the synagogue. Ma'ariv and the Megillah will follow in the Main Synagogue at 6:00 o'clock.

Children from kindergarten through grade six should be brought to the auditorium of the synagogue house at 5:45. They will be met there by special counselors who will provide them with the traditional noisemakers and who will help them during the course of the reading of the Megillah.

Following the Megillah the children will be brought back to the Auditorium where they will receive the special holiday goodies after which they can be picked up by their parents. We expect to have an especially large congregation of children and hence we ask that all parents cooperate with us in keeping to the schedule and following these simple instructions.

Prayers for Soviet Jewry

May we call to your attention that at our Purim eve service, we will say special prayers for Soviet Jewry in keeping with the general theme of the Megillah which describes an attempt on the part of a tyrant to destroy the Jewish people and blot them out from the scene of their earthly existence. Just as this tyrant fell, we pray for the fall of all tyrants who would do harm to our people and to the Jewish spirit.

Thursday Morning Readings

On Thursday morning we will have two readings of the Megillah. The first will take place as part of the morning service which begins at 7:00 o'clock.

The second reading is especially arranged for women and children and will take place from 10:30 in the morn-

RABBI AND MRS. JOSEPH H. LOOKSTEIN EXPECTED HOME FOR THIS SHABBAT

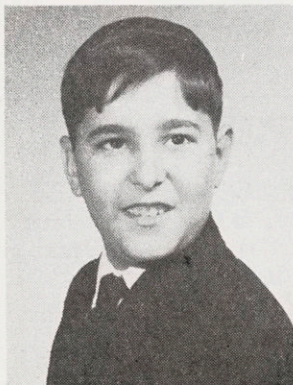

Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun's Annual Brunch initiating the traditional campaign for Yeshiva University will be held on Sunday, March 28th, at 10:00 A.M., announces Joseph Roth, chairman of the event.

In a statement of appreciation to Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun, Dr. Samuel Belkin, President of Yeshiva University, stressed that the institution, "in common with other universities throughout the land, is in a financial crisis precipitated by a lethargic economy and the curtailment of legislated funds. Lacking substantial endowments and sources of income available to other universities, YU can turn only to its devoted friends, those who have unreservedly supported it over the years."

Serving with Mr. Roth as honorary chairmen are Max J. Etra, Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein and Rabbi Haskel Lookstein. Vice chairmen are: Harry W.

Baumgarten, Elias M. Black, A. Milton Brown, Harry Heyman, Eugene Hollander, Joseph Lorch, Edward Low, Samuel A. Marcus, Irwin Shapiro, Jack D. Weller, and Abraham R. Winer.
