TWENTY-THIRD ANNIVERSARY OF ISRAEL'S INDEPENDENCE

On Thursday, April 29th, the 23rd anniversary of the greatest event in Jewish history for the past 1900 years will be commemorated. We are referring, of course, to Yom Ha'atzmaut, the annual celebration of Israel's achieving independence on the fifth day of Iyar 5708 (1948).

All over the world Jews will gather in synagogues to celebrate the renewal of Israel's independence in our day following a long and bitter exile which was climaxed by the Holocaust in Europe. FOUR HUNDRED CONTRIBUTE \$7,000 to PASSOVER RELIEF APPEAL

The Passover Relief Appeal of this year received warm and generous response from the membership of Kehilath Jeshurun. More than 400 donors contributed a sum close to \$7,000. We have reason to feel proud of this result.

Because of this generosity we were able to help many deserving causes, institutions and individuals. Our Russian brethren were the chief beneficiaries of our appeal. Twenty-Five Hundred Dollars was donated to the Ezra Fund of the Rabbinical Council of America for food packages to our brothers in the Soviet lands. The Joint Passover Relief Committee, which takes care of the poor of our city, received \$1,500. The Ezras Torah Fund, one of the most deserving agencies that helps needy and deserving rabbis and scholars, received \$500.

Institutions of learning, here and in Israel, received over \$1,000 and individual rabbis who do not come to the attention of public charities were helped by us.

Before long, the full record of our pre-Passover benevolences, as well as those throughout the year, will be published. In the meantime, we wish to express our heartiest thanks to the entire Kehilath Jeshurun family for their warm response. May God continue to enable us to perform kind acts for all that is worthy.

REVEALING NEWS ITEM ON ISRAEL

In a recent issue of the Jewish Telegraphic Agency News Bulletin, a high State Department official was described as having advised a group of businessmen that if the Soviet Union should join in an Egyptian attempt to capture the Sinai Peninsula, the United States would consider that the balance of power in the Middle East will have been disrupted. The official, who declined to be publicly identified, did not indicate what the U.S. would do in such a situation.

The official stressed that the United States has at least a moral commitment to Israel and that it has pledged to preserve the balance of power. Nevertheless, there was no indication what the U.S. would do in such an eventuality.

This news item clarifies the essential reason why the State of Israel refuses to withdraw from secure boundaries in exchange for guarantees and peace
