RABBI JOSEPH H. LOOKSTEIN TO REVIEW "MY NAME IS ASHER LEV"

FOR SISTERHOOD

You have probably read it; you may have discussed it; you have certainly heard about it. Now you will have a chance to listen and react to a review of Chaim Potok's latest book, "My Name is Asher Lev" at the forthcoming Sisterhood luncheon meeting on Monday, November 27th at 12 o'clock.

The reviewer will be Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein, whose analyses of this kind of literature have not been heard by the Sisterhood for a number of years. His review, therefore, of this controversial and fascinating book will be especially welcome.

You will have an opportunity to hear for yourself and, we repeat, to react and express your own views about Potok and his art, about Lev and his development, about Jewish writing and about writing which deals with Jews.
