Ramaz to Graduate Sixty-Three Seniors With Outstanding College Admission Record

The class of 1973 in the Ramaz Upper School is about to be graduated on June 13 with one of the best college admission records in the history of the school. This is a class which has earned many honors, including five Merit Finalists, and a Westinghouse Honorable Mention, among other significant achievements.

The large quantity and the high quality of their acceptance to college serve to demonstrate the high regard in which they and their school are held by admission officers throughout the country. At the 101st Annual Meeting of Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun which was marked by surprises and emotion, nostalgia and reverence, the Associate Rabbi of the Congregation, Haskel Lookstein, was elected by acclamation as the Rabbi of Kehilath Jeshurun. The motion for that election was called for by President Harry W. Baumgarten in a special proclamation which cited the fifteen years of service rendered to the congregation by the former Associate Rabbi.

At the same time, the President asked for the election of Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein, who is about to celebrate his fiftieth anniversary of service in Kehilath Jeshurun, as the Senior Rabbi of the Congregation. The assemblage responded to both suggestions by rising to its feet in an expression of support and enthusiasm. It was a moment which will long be remembered by those who participated in this historic occasion.

At the conclusion of that election, Mr. Baumgarten called on Rabbi Joseph H. Lookstein, the new Senior Rabbi of the Congregation, for his closing remarks. The Rabbi devoted his remarks to a discussion of the theme "What is a Synagogue?" In various ways he demonstrated that a synagogue is part of a Jew. "It belongs to you; you don't merely belong to it." It is a mark of identification, a symbol of association with all of Jewish life, an opportunity to share in a community endeavor, and, above all, it is learning how to be a total Jew through prayer, through piety, and through good deeds.

Following the Rabbi's address, the gathering moved to the Social Hall where a delightful collation was served and where a spirit of camaraderie and mutual well wishing was very much in evidence. All in all, the 101st Annual Meeting was a very good beginning for our second century of activity.

National Freedom Assembly in Washington D.C. On Sunday, June 17

One day before the scheduled arrival of Soviet Communist Party Secretary, Leonid Brezhnev, a National Freedom Assembly will be held by Jewish communities within a 350 mile radius of Washington D.C. The Greater New York Conference on Soviet Jewry has asked us to support this assembly by our own delegation from Kehilath Jeshurun and Ramaz.

The program will begin at 1:30, with a convocation on the steps of the Capitol, featuring leaders of the three major religious faiths in the United States. From the Capitol, there will be a march to the Ellipse, near the Washington Monument where a mass rally will be held. National figures will participate in this historic gathering. The program will conclude by 4:15 P.M.

We would like to have several buses leave at 8:00 A.M. from in front of the Synagogue Building. The charge for adults will be \$10.00. For students between ages of 10 and 21, the charge will be \$5.00. Please call Hannah Cohen at the synagogue office to reserve a place for yourself. We will provide as many seats as we have people who are willing to demonstrate their solidarity for Soviet Jewry at this most critical point. Please call today, so that we may plan accordingly.
