JOSEPH SCHLANG, BENJAMIN MANDELKER AND IRWIN ROBINS ANNOUNCED AS CHATANIM FOR SIMCHAT TORAH: INDUCTION ON SH'MINI ATZERET MORNING

Chatan Torah

Our Chatan Torah who will be honored by being called for the last Aliyah of the year, completing the Torah Scroll, is a Trustee of the congregation who has been active in Jewish communal life for over forty years. A Founder of Albert Einstein College of Medicine and a Master Builder of Yeshiva University, he also served as Secretary and Treasurer of the Synagogue Council of America. He organized the Junior League of the Union of Orthodox Jewish Congregations of America in 1934.

Mr. Schlang published the Graphic History of the Jewish Heritage and helped to organize the Patron Program of the Metropolitan Opera in this city. He is now distributing opera films, one of which, "The Life of Giuseppe Verdi" will open next month at the Trans Lux Theatre in our neighborhood. The proceeds from this film work will go towards a variety of cultural projects.

Mr. Schlang, who is married to the former Bernice Breitbart, and whose son, Stuart, is a member of our congregation and a graduate of Ramaz, has been conducting two radio programs during the past two years: "Opera Stars of Tomorrow" and "101 Ways to Improve New York City."

Benjamin Mandelker, who will be called for the honor of beginning a new cycle of reading the Torah, is a former National Vice President of the UOJCA, who has a long career in labor law and in service to the Jewish community.

A graduate of Columbia College as a member of Phi Beta Kappa and the recipient of a law degree from Harvard, Ben served as a Captain in the 94th Infantry Division of the U. S. Army during World War II, earned a Bronze Star Medal and five Battle Stars. On the home front, he married the former Evelyn Ostow, who, following an active career in communal affairs on Long Island, now serves as a legal paraprofessional in Ben's office.

Our Chatan Bereishit was the first President of the Hebrew Academy of Nassau County, a school that was patterned after Ramaz. He was also the Chairman of the Committee for Kashruth at the Long Island Jewish Hospital.

Ben's son, Philip, who recently left on Aliyah, is serving in the Legal Division of the Finance Ministry in Israel. His daughter, Ronne, is a member of the Faculty in English and Social Studies at the Ramaz Upper School.

Our Chatan Maftir is a graduate of Amherst College, Cum Laude, and a member of Phi Beta Kappa. A former Lieutenant in the U. S. Air Force, Irwin Robins was graduated Cum Laude from Harvard Law School and served as Assistant U. S. Attorney in the southern district of New York. He is currently a partner in the firm Otterbourg, Steindler, Houston & Rosen.

A Trustee of the congregation and a member of its newly formed Executive Committee, Mr. Robins served as Secretary of the Commission on Synagogue Relations of Federation. He has also been a member of the Board of Jewish Education in this city and he is a member of the Manhattan Cabinet of UJA.

Last year, during the crisis following the Yom Kippur War, he was instrumental in raising tens of thousands of dollars for UJA and Israel Bonds among members of our congregation.

Irwin is married to the former Susan Starkman. Their two daughters Frannie and Hannah are both students in Ramaz. Sue Robins serves as an Editor of the Ramaz Parents Council's publication "The Ram Kol."

TO REPLACE DESTROYED TORAH SCROLLS

In late June of this year, the synagogue in Khust, a town near the Russian-Hungarian border, was partially destroyed by fire. All of the Torah Scrolls were lost in the flames. The circumstances were quite suspicious. Khust is a one-factory town. The workers in the factory proposed to use the Jewish synagogue as a sports palace. The resident Jews refused. A press campaign ensued with no sign of weakness on the part of the Jews. Shortly thereafter, the synagogue was victimized by fire.

The Jews have returned to their synagogue and persist in davening there. But they have no Torah from which to read . . . The New York Conference on Soviet Jewry has asked our congregation to provide a Torah for the Jews of Khust. That Torah will be presented to Elie Wiesel, who was born in the area of Khust, at a Simchat Torah Festival of Freedom on Sunday, October 6 at 12:30 in Gracie Mansion Park, 84th Street and East End Avenue.

We are asking the entire congregation and the student body and parent body of Ramaz School to gather in front of our synagogue at 11:30 that Sunday morning in order to march with the Torah to the Rally at Gracie Mansion Park.
