Barry was helped in his work not only by Mr. Harry Fierman, instructor of chemistry at Ramaz, but also by Dr. Terry Krulwich Posner, Associate Pro-

fessor of Biochemistry at the Mt. Sinai Medical School. Dr. Krulwich is herself a graduate of Ramaz.

The subject of Barry's research was entitled: "A Study of Sugar Transport
