# RABBI HASKEL LOOKSTEIN TO ADDRESS SISTER-HOOD AT OPENING MEETING, MON., OCT. 20th

The 1975-76 season of the Sister-hood will begin on Monday, October 20th, at 12:30 P.M. with an open luncheon meeting in our Synagogue House. The guest speaker for the afternoon will be Rabbi Haskel Lookstein.

The Rabbi will review Lucy Davidowicz's recently published book, "The War Against the Jews," a scholarly and comprehensive analysis of Hitler's

plan to exterminate six million Jews. This is a book which will be talked about for many years to come. It will be interesting to hear the Rabbi comment on the book, particularly since he is doing research himself into the Jewish reaction to the Holocaust.

### SIMCHAT TORAH FESTIVAL OF FREEDOM FOR SOVIET JEWRY

The annual demonstration in behalf of the observance of Simchat Torah by Soviet Jews will be held this year on Tuesday, Chol Ha-Moed, September 23rd at 12:00 noon, outside of the New York Public Library, 42nd Street and Fifth Avenue. It is a city-wide demonstration sponsored by the New York Conference on Soviet Jewry.

On that occasion, there will be symbolic Hakafot with singing and dancing on the Library steps. A former

Prisoner of Conscience, Shimon Grilius, will be the guest of honor.

Members of the Kehilath Jeshurun-Ramaz community are urged to attend this demonstration in order to support the observance of Simchat Torah by Soviet Jews, which is a vital force for the Soviet Jewish renaissance. Anyone who has seen or heard about Simchat Torah in the Soviet Union will understand the significance of our demonstration on Tuesday, September 23rd at 12:00 noon.

## COMMUNITY BLOOD BANK FORMED
