Two Ramaz Seniors Finalists in Westinghouse Competition

We are very proud to announce that two Ramaz seniors, Sharon Appelbaum and Daniel Ozick, are among 300 seniors nationwide who have won honors in the Westinghouse competition and who are in a position to be among the 40 who will actually receive the Westinghouse scholarships.

This competition attracts 22,000 seniors from all over the country, each of whom must present the results of an original research project in science, in addition to demonstrating all-around excellence in academic work. It is most gratifying when a school has one representative in that competition. Two finalists are a special source of blessing and pride.

Our congratulations to Sharon and Daniel, their respective families and the entire Ramaz faculty, especially the Science Department. Our particular thanks to Dr. Terry Krulwich, Professor of Biochemistry at the Mount Sinai School of Medicine — and a Ramaz alumna — who inspired, supervised and guided the research of these two young scientists.
