COME AND JOIN US - EVENING AND MORNING

The joyous festival of Purim will be ushered in on Monday evening, March 15, with the annual Purim Eve service featured by the reading of the Megillah by ten Ramaz students. The entire congregational and Ramaz family is invited to participate in this glorious event.

Children are the Guests of Honor

A special place in front of the Main Synagogue will be set aside for children of elementary school age, from 4 years through grade 6. They should arrive at the Synagogue at 5:45 P.M. There they will assemble under the supervision of our youth leaders, who will provide them with the traditional noisemakers. They will be escorted into the Main Synagogue at a special point in the service and at the conclusion of the service, they will, of course, receive the special holiday sweets which make Purim a unique delight. We expect that the entire service will be concluded by 8:00 P.M.

Israel Fair to Follow Megillah Reading

After the service is over, an Israel Fair will be held in the Auditorium and in the Ramaz Dining Hall. This Fair will be sponsored and conducted by the Student Organization of the Ramaz Upper School.

A large display of Israel merchandise including food products, stamps, coins, T-shirts, art objects, books and records will be available for purchase. Felafel will also be sold for those who want to break their fast or simply enjoy the occasion a little more. All proceeds from this Fair will go to the Israel Emergency Fund.

Last year around Purim time, there was an exchange of letters between myself and the editors of *Time Magazine*, on which we reported in the Bulletin. The exchange concerned the most unfortunate designation of King Faisal of Saudi Arabia as *Time Magazine*'s "Man of the Year for 1974." In my letter, I wrote as follows:

"Your choice of the Man of the Year of 1974 is an insult to the intelligence of your readership and does not speak well for your editorship either. There is but one consolation. A Man of the Year who has risen to his place because of power, arrogance and disdain for his fellow man, may ultimately fall from that place for the very same reasons. There is ample precedent for this in the past."

Purim time is an occasion for remembering that things have a way of turning around. The Jewish people in Shushan faced certain annihilation. They were depressed, absorbed in mourning and devoid of hope. By means of Divine providence, the arrogance of Haman was turned against himself and the mourning gave way to gladness, the depression to joy.

At the conclusion of my letter last year, I wrote to *Time*: "I am sure that many of your readers hope that the 1974 Man of the Year will become the 1975 Fall of the Year. May your magazine have occasion to report the fall of this latest rise."

Little did we realize at the time that the fall was so imminent. It occurred in the form of a political assassination on March 25, 1975 and was duly reported in *Time Magazine* in the issue of April 7th.

"When your enemy falls, do not rejoice," is a Biblical command. But we do take notice of this turnabout on the occasion of the festival which celebrates the dramatic changes in fortune which have beset all of Israel's foes throughout history. "Thus may all your foes be destroyed, O' Israel."
