DR. MICHAEL SIGALL, AN AUTHOR

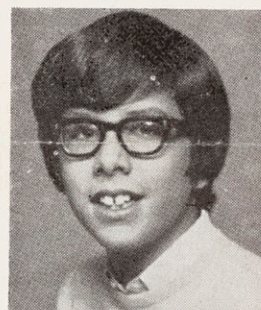

The Jews of our generation understand that we must never forget the murder of six million, and the cruel treatment of hundreds of thousands of others. Time should not dim the sacrifices. The passing of years should not allow the tragedy to fade from our memories.

Holocaust Day is observed throughout the world by Jews who have resolved never to forget. We call upon the community to participate in this Service, and, in that way, to join the Jewish people the world over in this sacred Mitzvah.

A WELCOME TO ALEXANDER LUNTZ

Many of the members of our Congregation and the Ramaz family had the privilege of meeting Dr. Luntz at his home in Moscow. He is a man of great intellect, with an aristocratic bearing and a sensitivity to ideas, ideals and spiritual matters that impress everyone who meets him.

Dr. Luntz will be the guest of the Congregation at Shabbat Services on May 1st. He will address the community at a Seudah Shlishith that afternoon. The Seudah will follow Mincha which will be at 7:15.

The entire community is invited to greet this Jewish hero who will also be the Guest of Honor of the New York Jewish community at the Solidarity Sunday program on the following day.

SOLIDARITY SUNDAY

May 2nd

Once again this year we hope that our community will turn out in the

thousands, to join hundreds of thousands of our fellow New Yorkers in an unprecedented display of solidarity with Soviet Jews. The last year has been one of the most painful ones for the refuseniks in the Soviet Union. Some have been imprisoned. Many have been conscripted into the army. Hundreds have been banished from employment. Very few have received visas. If there were ever a time for an unprecedented show of strength by the New York community, that time is this year.

We invite members of the Congregation and the Ramaz family to assemble at 10:00 o'clock in front of the Synagogue. From there we will march down Park Avenue to our own assembly point with the Manhattan Coalition on Soviet Jewry. We have been given a front position in the Parade this year, so that those who march with us will be able to see and hear the program with ease.

The slogan of this year's Solidarity Sunday is: "Every One Of Them Needs Every One Of Us." Kehilath Jeshurun and Ramaz members know that the reverse is also true. Every one of us needs every one of them!

ISRAEL INDEPENDENCE DAY

Tuesday Evening, May 4th

Once again this year we will sponsor a special service on the Eve of Israel Independence Day which this year occurs on Tuesday Evening, May 4th. At 7:30 we will hold that service in the Main Synagogue.
