Ramaz Seniors Establish Outstanding Record as School Completes 39th Year

Two Westinghouse Finalists And Two National Merit Finalists Head List Of Honors

We are proud to congratulate the Ramaz School, which is sponsored by Congregation Kehilath Jeshurun, on the eve of the Commencement Exercises of the Joseph H. Lookstein Upper School of Ramaz. Once again, the school has brought great honor to itself and to the Jewish community through the outstanding achievements of its senior class.

Two students of the senior class were Finalists (in a group of 300 out of 22,000 seniors across the country) in the Westinghouse Science Talent Search. Two more students were Finalists in the National Merit Competition, while 12 earned Letters of Commendation.

New York State Regents Scholarships

As in the past, our percentage of winners and alternates in the New York State Scholarship Competition was the highest among all yeshivot. Of 59 students who were eligible to participate in this competition, 31 earned scholarships immediately, while 10 more were given high alternate status which assured them of scholarships, should they decide to attend college in New York State.
