GEORGE WASHINGTON AND THE JEWS (Feb. 22)

There were only about 2000 Jews in America at the time when the colonies broke away from thier mother country, England. A predominant number of them drew their sustenance from connections with England; yet they joined the colonists in their struggle for freedom and supported George Washington. The following is an excerpt of a letter George Washington wrote to the Jews of Newport, Rhode Island: "It would be inconsistent with the frankness of my character not to avow that I am pleased with your favorable opinion of my administration and fervent wishes of my felicity. May the children of the stock of Abraham, who dwell in this land, continue to merit and enjoy the good will of the other inhabitants, while everyone shall sit in safety under his own vine and fig tree and there shall be none to make him afraid."

FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

Jewish lore tells of two rabbis who traveled about from city to city in Israel. "Bring us the guardians of the city," they asked in each place. When the senators were brought forward, they seemed dissatisfied. When the chief of the City Guard was summoned, they refused to meet with him. "These are not the true guardians of they city," they exclaimed. "Fetch us, please, those who teach you and your children our holy Torah. They are responsible for the safety of your city. . . ."

President Johnson has recently proposed a massive federal aid program for education. He understands only too well that the future security of our country will be determined not so much by a costly defense program as by the emergence of an educated America. I would merely add that education msut not only consist of the imparting of faets; it must include the teaching of values as well. History has taught us the bitter lesson of a nation which could utilize the greatest scientific achievements for the purpose of a bestial destruction of human life. This is why the teachers of Torah are called the true guardians of the city. It is only a people imbued with the ideals of the ethics of the Bible which can create a safe society dedicated to the dignity and brotherhood of man.

The Lincoln Square Synagogue has already begun to help safeguard our community through the study of Torah. Our Adult Education Institute (which has more than quadrupled in attendance during the past six weeks) will meet at 9:00 P.M. each Wednesday evening, starting February 10 (until that time we shall maintain our 8:30 P.M. schedule). This will enable us to begin another class at 8:20 P.M. on The Art of Hebrew Reading. Needless to say, everyone is invited to attend one or both of these study groups.

We are likewise considering the possibility of opening a Sunday School for youngsters during the present spring semester. Since this is dependent upon the number of registrants, we are enxiously awaiting the responses to the questionnaires which we have already sent you.

Judaism is a fascinating study. It is a priceless heritage, a magnificent welt-anschauung, a specific way of life. It is only through the education of the younger and older generations together that the beauty, vitality and relevance of Jewish living can be truly appreciated.

'NEVER BELIEVE ANY WAR WILL BE SMOOTH' (1930—From "A Roving Commission")

"Let us learn our lessons. Never, never, never believe any war will be smooth and easy, or that anyone who embarks on the strange voyage can measure the tides and hurricanes he will encounter. The statesman who yields to war fever must realize that once the signal is given, he is no longer the master of policy but the slave of unforeseeable and uncontrollable events. Antiquated War Offices, weak, incompetent or arrogant commanders, untrustworthy allies, hostile neutrals, malignant fortune, ugly surprises, awful miscalculations — all take their seats at the Council Board on the morrow of a declaration of war. Always remember, however sure you are that you can easily win, that there would not be a war if the other man did not think he also had a chance."

We mourn the loss of this great statesman — a man for all mankind.

A View From The Editor

That toddlers as well as older children imitate their elders in the process of learning, is an undeniable fact. Just how much spiritual growth the child will achieve, depends in no small measure upon the parents — their own activities as well as their firmness in tactfully insisting that the child study, absorb and practice. Acting as a guide for the mental and spiritual development of the child, the parents may be likened to the windows of Heaven through which the Holy Countenance radiates family unity, warmth, love, patience, wisdom, knowledge and brotherhood along the pathways of Peace.

Being a Jew in body and soul, is a precious birthright which should faithfully be nurtured and preserved. When a Bar Mitzvah boy has concentrated for a short period of time on learning the Torah Blessings for recitation upon reaching manhood in the Jewish tradition and soon thereafter forgets them and disregards many things Jewish the effect of such Bar Mitzvah ritual has little permanent value other than a memory of a milestone reached. As a rule, such youngster knows little about the priceless Jewish studies in traditional Torah, Jewish education, history, culture, ethics and other varied fields of knowledge which constitute our unexcelled, rich religious heritage. Unacquainted with even the barest essentials of Judaism, unable to read Hebrew, and being unaware of his importance as a connecting link in the chain of Jewish survival, just how can he in time, withstand the seemingly overpowering pressures to defect from Judaism? Is he adequately forearmed with knowledge of his own heritage to overcome the influences based on distortions and misinterpretations? In his weak and pliable state of mind, he is easy prey for assimilation, especially if, as so many youngsters seeking an out-of-town schooling do, he be away from home and Jewish environment, and have no mentor to encourage his status as a Jew.

The reason for such deviating religious behavior is the parents' neglect of their sacred duty properly to train their offspring in the paths of Judaism -NOT merely shortly before the Bar Mitzvah. but CONTINUOUSLY EARLY CHILDHOOD. The child must become saturated with Jewish values. The parents themselves, by example, must first acquaint themselves with what the TORAH teaches — they must try to observe the Jewish traditional practices and actually lead the child by hand to attend SYNAGOGUE services. In addition, they themselves should master and appreciate Jewish ideals by reading outstanding Jewish literature and by participating in communal activities.

Children Have The Right To Spiritual Inheritance!

Let it not be said that the Jewish parents failed their children by inadequate guidance, instruction and encouragement. LOOK NOW TO YOUR CHILDREN'S WELFARE! Give them the spiritual lift through early Jewish education.


