



**FROM THE RABBI'S DESK . . .**

"Get thee out of thy country and out of thy birthplace and out of thy father's house unto the land that I will show thee." Thus the first commandment which God gave to Abraham, the first Jew: the obligation to leave his homeland and journey to the land of Israel. Throughout our great history, *Eretz Israel* has therefore been the land of our forefathers, the site of our Holy Temple, the place in which the prophets preached and Jewish law flourished. And from the year 70 C.E. onwards (when the Second Temple was destroyed), Israel became the symbol of the yearning for independence which characterized the wandering Jewish people for the past two thousand years. All of our daily, Sabbath and Holiday prayers are filled with references to a national restoration and an overwhelming love for Zion.

How impossible it seemed that a two-thousand-year-old-dream would ever be fulfilled. But yet God "works in mysterious ways his wonders to perform." From the very ashes of Auschwitz and Treblinka arose the foundation of the modern Jewish State, despite the military protest of a powerful Arab bloc. The modern-day miracle of the re-emergence of the State of Israel after so many years of prayer, pain and persecution can only be compared to the miracle of the original Exodus from Egypt and Conquest of Canaan. Every Jew in the world can now stand a bit straighter and speak with a bit more confidence, secure in the knowledge that his interests will be protected by a voice in the United Nations. Please join with us on Wednesday evening, May 5th, to pay tribute to and thank the Almighty for the State of Israel.

President's Message

MY FRIENDS

I don't have to tell you how delighted I am to have seen us reach this day, and I know you all share with me the joy of this achievement.

Today we witness but another step toward our ambitious goal, so that this is not the end but rather the beginning and thus we cannot rest and merely reflect on our accomplishments, now we must rededicate ourselves to the tasks ahead.

Now more than ever before we must work to build our permanent Temple. The concept of our Synagogue is, always has been, and I hope always will be, a beacon for those who have, somehow, lost communication with traditional Judaism. Through love and education we have already seen several miraculous religious experiences, I'm sure there will be many others.

Our strategic location demands that we share it with the world; one of the ideas brought forward is the creation of a Jewish library, another is housing the Warsaw Memorial and there are many others being explored, and if only one comes to pass it shall make all the work, that has been done, worthwhile.

Less than five years ago, this area was one of the cities most blighted slums, but the great Architect had other plans for the West Side, and so with the help of his angels in the forms of legislators, builders, architects, bankers and management men, came this great complex of buildings and with these buildings came our people, who were not content with merely food, clothing and shelter. . . . Less than three years ago a handful of men and women met and decided to underwrite the formation of our organization, the risks were high and there were no assurances that these funds would ever be recovered. History now shows the results of that meeting and the future never looked brighter. Being the one who called that first meet-

JUDAISM AND MEDICINE: BASIC SIMILARITIES

A fundamental value common to both Judaism and medicine is the high value they place on human dignity and human life. The Talmud tells us that human life is infinitely precious and beyond measure. The physician spends his life in the preservation of this precious treasure. So central to basic Judaic teaching is this concept about life, that we are taught if a man saves the life of a single person, it is as if he saved a whole world. Every day the physician engages in a battle to maintain life. It makes no difference, we are told, whether life is preserved for a hundred years, or a single second. Both are equally precious. The exhortation in our teachings is to choose life. It then becomes a religious duty to maintain good health, and also to aid the sick. Fundamental religious observances are set aside in favor of healing. Sabbath obligations are put aside if there is a risk of life. Fasting is not required of the young, nursing or pregnant women, or if there is any other threat to life. It is of interest that the day prescribed for circumcision occurs when the baby's blood clotting factors have reached a safe level. So basic is the concern for life in Judaism, that the teaching is to postpone the Brith if the child is ill, or if there is a family history of a bleeding disease. With this noble heritage, it is of little wonder that the traditional toast for Jews on festive occasions is *L'Chaim*.
