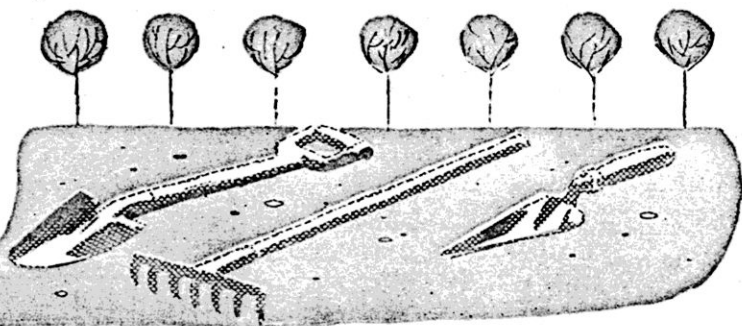

FROM THE RABBI'S DESK

The Sabbath is one of the priceless contributions of the Jew to our civilization. It is the symbol of man's freedom from the slavery of labor, from the subjugation of our minds and spirits to our material needs. Its unique importance in Jewish tradition is attested to by its inclusion in the Decalogue, the fundamental law of all religion: "Remember the Sabbath Day to keep it holy."

The great Jewish thinker Achaad HaAm once wrote: "More than the Jews have kept the Sabbath, the Sabbath has kept the Jews." Despite the scorn and abuse to which our people have been subjected for thousands of years, despite the mundane, material concerns which plague almost every moment of our daily lives, each house-holder becomes a king and his wife a queen as they welcome the celestial angels to the redolent Sabbath table. The golden-brown twisted *challah* reminiscent of the ancient manna from heaven, the fish and meat symbolic of the delicacies reserved for the righteous in the world-to-come (*Leviathan* and *Shor HaBor*), and the special Sabbath kugels and dumplings cannot but spark a festive spirit. The Sabbath candles genuinely reflect the warmth and light of the Jewish home as the husband praises his wife (*Eishes Chayil*), blesses his children and intones the kiddush over the wine. Between courses the room re-sounds with music and merriment as the traditional *zemirot* are chanted with enthusiasm and fervor.

The Sabbath is an "oasis in time," one day in seven reserved for the ideals of the heart, the mind, the soul. It provides a refuge from the competitive struggles of weekday pursuits and stands as a haven of harmony and inner peace. The Sabbath is the bedrock of the Jewish religious experience, the day which mystically unites man to world, man to man and man to God.

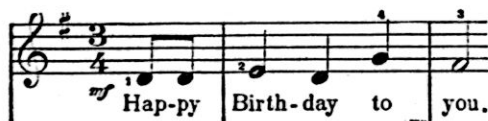

Sabbath Vocabulary

SHKIA — Sunset. The Sabbath commences with sunset on Friday. In order to protect the Sanctity of the day, however, the women kindle the candles twenty minutes before SHKIA.

KIDDUSH — Sanctification of the wine, symbolizing the sanctification of the physical which is the goal of Jewish law.

LECHEM MISHNA — Two loaves of challah symbolizing the double portion of manna enjoyed by the Jews in the desert.

ZEMIROT — traditional songs chanted during the Sabbath meals.

BLECH — Tin sheet covering the burner which guards the food from direct contact with the fire. With the use of a *blech*, the warming of pre-cooked solid foods is permitted on the Sabbath.

HAVDALAH — literally, distinction. The ceremony at the conclusion of the Sabbath which marks the distinction between the Sabbath and week-day, the holy and profane. A separate blessing is recited over wine, over a lit candle of many wicks (symbolizing the fact that with the end of the Sabbath the use of fire is permitted), and over fragrant spices (for the purpose of refreshing our souls, saddened by the departure of the Sabbath).

TSAIS HAKOCHAVIM — The coming out of the stars (at least three) which signals the conclusion of the Sabbath. This is at least forty minutes after SHKIA or one hour after *licht bentschen* (the blessing over the Sabbath Candles) was on Friday.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Early in my association with Rabbi Riskin it was mutually agreed that I would not interfere with his duties theologically, and he would not interfere with my duties secularly. It has proven to be a fair and equitable arrangement.

This does not mean that we do not consult each other on the particular issues; on the contrary, every important decision made thus far has been discussed and in some cases argued (amiably), and only after we both finally agree, is the matter carried out.

It is most important that the leadership of the Temple be a harmonious team with goals mutually acceptable and stimulating. We both take particular pride in seeing the development of the heretofore uninitiated and unaffiliated, develop religiously. This is being accomplished by a program that is not labelled, but for the want of a descriptive name we call modern traditional Judaism. It is my hope that the future leadership of our congregation shall continue in the manner which we have introduced.

The membership committee, under the chairmanship of Stanley Getzler, has reported an increase of ten per cent in the month of January, thereby increasing our membership to well over 200 families. Mr. Getzler has done an outstanding job; however, the increase in our membership adds to our problem of adequate facilities.

The phenomenal growth of our congregation has surpassed our ability to provide seats for them at our services and is certainly discouraging many from becoming members, unless we start construction immediately. I do fear we may lose some people who might have great potential leadership and we cannot afford this kind of loss.

The road ahead is clear. The work is cut out for us, the challenge is a worthy one and success is imminent.

This is not intended to lull anyone into complacency, but merely to pass on to you my confidence in our endeavor and encourage you to continue the fine work already being done.

Did You Know?

- That With over 650 Jewish Servicemen and Civilians in Viet Nam only one Jewish Chaplain is on the spot to minister to their religious needs.
- That The Gallup poll recently showed that 80% of the electorate polled said they would vote for a Jewish candidate for president, an increase of 18% since 1958.
- That The Ukrainian Academy of Science is taking the lead in a violent attack on Jews and the Jewish religion even though their Anti Jewish book was suppressed two years ago by Moscow.
- That The city officials of Kiev decided to erect a memorial to Jewish and other victims of Nazi Mass Murders at Bobi Ya. The Soviets have never admitted that most of the victims of Bobi Ya were Jewish.
- That The Synagogue in Tallinn, Estonia is to be razed for an urban renewal project but permission to the 4000 Estonian Jews to relocate their house of worship was refused. This is the 360th Synagogue closed by the Soviets since 1959.
- That India and Pakistan have been lobbying hard for the support of the Arab States, but Pakistan has the edge, this despite India's siding with the Arabs, in the question of Jordan waters against Israel. Pakistan chided India for cooperating with Israel by having a consulate general in Bombay which was promptly denied by India's Krishna Menon who declared that India does not have one matchstick of equipment from Israel either bought — given or exchanged. This bidding for Arab support by down grading Israel demeans India as an apostle of non alignment.
- That While American Rabbis participating in a Geneva interfaith conference felt that Anti semitism was no longer a problem — the European Rabbis differed sharply.
- That "Hooliganism" disease of our time also has hit Israel with an attack by gangs of Tel Aviv youths in the Arab town of Ramle. This has been denounced by Mr. Eshkol.
- That The Japanese Hitachi Electronic firm has denounced the Arab boycott and expressed its willingness to sell to Israel — The boycott of their products has been lifted by the Ministry of Commerce of Israel.
