From the Rabbi's Desk...

During these tense days of Mid-East crises, the feelings of the committed Jew towards his homeland are deep and complex. The following letter, which appeared in a number of magazines as well as in an ad published by the New York Times, reflects the emotions of many of us:

A LETTER TO THE WORLD FROM JERUSALEM

I am a Jerusalemite-like yourselves, a man of flesh and blood. I am a citizen of my city, an integral part of my people.

I have a few things to get off my chest. Because I am not a diplomat, I do not have to mince words. I do not have to please you, or even persuade you. You did not build this city; you do not live in it; you did not defend it when they came to destroy it. And we will be damned if we will let you take it away.


On every Yom Kippur and Passover we fervently voiced the hope that next year would find us in Jerusalem. Your inquisitions, pogroms, expulsions, the ghettos into which you jammed us, your forced baptisms, your quota systems, your genteel anti-semitism, and the final unspeakable horror, the holocaust (and worse, your terrifying disinterest in it)—all these have not broken us. They may have sapped what little moral strength you still possessed, but they forged us into steel. Do you think that you can break us now, after all we have been through? Do you really believe that after Dachau and Auschwitz we are frightened by your threats of blockades and sanctions? We have been to Hell and back—a Hell of your making. What more could you possibly have in your arsenal that could scare us?

I have watched this city bombarded twice by nations calling themselves civilized. In 1948, while you looked on apathetically, I saw women and children blown to smithereens, this after we had agreed to your request to internationalize the city.

And then the savage sacking of the Old City: the willful slaughter, the wanton destruction of every synagogue and religious school; the desecration of Jewish cemeteries; the sale by a ghoulish government of tomb stones for building materials, for poultry runs, army camps—even latrines.

And you never said a word.

You never breathed the slightest protest when the Jordanians shut off the (Continued on Page 8)

The President's Message

The ceremonies of "Simchat Torah" culminate our Synagogue year and we are afforded an opportunity of evaluating our progress. This is the time when we inventory our accomplishments and render an account to our members and worshippers. Our tangible assets are in reality secondary to the programs and activities that we sponsored throughout the year, and it is the expansion of these services which provide the indicators of our annual growth.

Our High Holiday Services were almost oversubscribed, to the degree of threatening our available accommodations at both the Riverside Plaza Hotel and our regular quarters. The increase in attendance attests to the meaningful religious experience of our congregants and to the growing interest of the community in the content of our purpose and program.

With this New Year, we have broadened our horizons by engaging in a new series of educational projects. The response, interest and enthusiasm has been overwhelming. The completion of our building, which we desperately need, is proceeding as per schedule and will hopefully be ready for occupancy before Pesach. Plans are in progress for the orderly transfer to our new quarters.

We too, have been to the "Mountain Top." We can now visualize not only continued progress but a tremendous impact on our local Jewish community that will regenerate Jewish cultural and religious interest. We have established a focal point of Jewish life for the young and for the adult. The seeds are firmly planted, they have been nurtured and carefully tended, the harvest will be abundant.

The Riverside Plaza served as an adequate adjunct to 150 West End Avenue for these High Holvday Services, with a record 1300 during Yom Kippur at the Hotel alone. Rabbi Riskin spoke to a packed house Shabbat Shuvah afternoon on the symbolic significance of the Sanctification of the Moon, and even before Kol Nidre ADOLPH KATZ had already begun to erect the most magnificent Sukkah in our five year history. Impressively decorated by CELE and HENRIETTA EDELMAN - with gracious help by brother LOU --- it hosted eighty-eight people eating a full meal four times during the first two days of Yom Tov and at least one-hundred more for Kiddush. The Sisterhood cooperated beautifully, and MR. WOLF REICH-ARD - in his own inimitable way saw to it that not only our Hebrew High School but also everyone else who wished would have enough food to eat in the Sukkah . . . Lincoln Square Simchat Torah was joyously dizzy, with Rabbi Riskin spinning to the strains "Mi Hu Zeh." There were four separate Torah readings to allow everyone an aliyah (EDDIE DAVIS, EDDIE ABRAMSON, MOSHE GRAJAUER and STEVEN TIEFENBRUNN), with Steven Tiefenbrunn enthusiastically acting as the Mussaf sacrifice. Our three Chatonim (Bridegrooms of the Torah, of Bereshit and of Maftir) were RABBI RISKIN, ELMER KLEIN and WOLF REICHARD, with a constant Kiddush abounding in "spirits." The Rabbi merely got warmed up for Purim . . . RUTH BELSKY gave a truck a good scare and

holiest of our holy places, the Western Wall in violation of the pledges they made after the war-a war they waged, incidentally, against a decision of the U Not a murmur came from you whenever the legionnaires in their spiked helm casually opened fire upon our citizens from behind the walls.

Your hearts bled when Berlin came under siege. You rushed your air "to save the gallant Berliners." But you did not send one ounce of food way Jews starved in besieged Jerusalem. You thundered against the wall which East Germans ran through the middle of the German capital—but not one p out of you about that other wall, the one that tore through the heart of Jerusal

And when the same thing happened 20 years later, and the Arabs unleast a savage unprovoked bombardment of the Holy City again, did any of you anything? The only time you came to life was when the city was at last re-unit Then you wrung your hands and spoke loftily of "justice" and the need for "Christian" quality of turning the other cheek.

For the first time since the year 70 there is now complete religious freed for all in Jerusalem. We loathe the sword—but it was you who forced us to take it We crave peace—but we are not going back to the peace of 1948 as you would like us

We are home. It has a lovely sound for a nation you have willed to want over the face of the globe. We are not leaving. We have redeemed the pleamade by our forefathers: Jerusalem is being rebuilt. "Next year"—and the ye after, and after, until the end of time—"in Jerusalem!"

THE MONTH WITHOUT HOLIDAYS

We have left the exciting month of the holidays, the month of Tishri, and are now in the midst of the month called Cheshvan. However, Cheshvan is seldom referred to only by its name alone in Jewish tradition. The Hebrew word 'Mar' is usually prefixed to the name of the month. An explanation often given for this practice is that we desire to compensate for the fact that Cheshvan is the only month in the Jewish calendar without any holidays or special occasions. We do this by adding the title 'Mar', which means 'Mister' in Hebrew. Thus we do appease the month lacking in special days.

There is, however, another reason, one that is much more profound and meaningful for our day and times. The Hebrew word 'Mar' also means 'bitter'. Traditionally, the flood during the time of Noah took place during the month of Cheshvan. The Torah tells us that the society of Noah's time was corrupt. People were crassly inconsiderate of their neighbor's feelings and property. A disintegration was occurring that could only end in self-destruction, and so God decided to bring the flood. became Mar-Cheshvan, the bitter month when man ignored his fellow man. As we retain this ancient custom it is fitting that we carefully regard our relations with each other so that Mar-Cheshvan may be bitter in name only.
