

ARRANGEMENTS COMPLETED FOR GALA CHANUKKAH AFFAIR

On Sunday evening, December 2nd, the Young Israel of Parkchester will hold its annual Chanukkah Celebration at its headquarters, 2137 Ellis Avenue.

A Committee under the leadership of Boris Stern has been making special preparations for the occasion. Mr. Stern announced that in addition to a well known cantor who will perform the candle lighting ceremony, his Committee has arranged for the traditional games and plenty of food - in the real Young Israel manner. The admission price has been set at the nominal sum of fortynine cents.

CHANUKKAH

The Rabbis in asking the question "What is Chanukkah", answer with the familiar story of the brilliant and heroic victory of Judes Maccabeus over the vast army of Antiochus, King of Syria, who ruled over Palestine 2100 years ago. After the battle was over, the holy Temple was again entered and amid the ruins was found a small vessel containing unpolluted oil enough for one day's burning, but which miraculously sufficed for eight days. To commemorate this event we celebrate the feast of Chanukkah for eight days.

To understand the full import of the holiday one must perforce go somewhat deeper into the historical setting of the period when the event of Chanukkah occurred. Antiochus, the tyrant that he was, aimed to uproot the Jewish culture at its very foundation and replace it with the Greek. He resorted to cruelty, torture; he defiled the Temple and forbade Jewish observances. Those who did not submit suffered the death of martyrdom.

It was only after much struggle that a small band of loyal Jews under the leadership of the Priest Mattathias (continued on page 2)

and his five sons arose to resist the tyrants. Judas, one of these sons, proved to be a good strategist and in spite of the fact that the Jews were outnumbered, they achieved final Victory.

Chanukkah has been a source of inspiration to the Jewish people throughout our history. That inspiration sprung from the fact that the Victory that was achieved was not one of might but a Victory of the spirit. Had it not been for a small group of men who had conviction about what they were fighting for, Victory might never have been achieved.

It is this very spirit based on faith in G-d and in the rightness of our cause that has carried us through to the present day.

Our forebearers had faith in the value of spiritual power and they never relaxed in their efforts to become imbued themselves and to pass on to their children the traditions which made for strength to carry on in spite of the persecutions and trials and tribulations.

What were some of these values?
First and foremost they had faith in G-d, second, was a devotion to the synagogue and worship and third, was an insatiable thirst for study and knowl-(continued on page 3)

THE PRESIDENT SPEAKS -

The theme of the hour, the focal point for all eyes the world over is Palestine. It is our desire and duty to redeem the Holy Land, call it once again our home, and to welcome within its boundaries all of our displaced co-religionists.

How much longer shall we be tenants on this planet when by covenant and by recorded deed in the scriptures that are accepted by all nations, we own an area on the face of the globe which G-d set aside for us.

Could it be that the nations deny us our rights and privileges because we claim a large slice of the earth? By looking at a map it can be seen that Palestine is a small segment facing partly on the Mediterranean Sea, and bounded by Egypt, Trans-Jordania, Syria, and Lebanon. We desire no other territory than that which is rightfully ours.

Can the Jews of the Western Hemisphere continue a passive role, when
in the so-called great, cultured,
civilized countries of Europe over
five millions of our people have been
butchered, burned, gassed and poisoned? They do not permit us to live on
borrowed land, and they refuse to give
us back our own land! Are we a doomed
people?

NO we are not! because G-d is the Supreme One, and His wishes must be obeyed by all nations. Our ancestors were delivered out of Egypt and brought into Palestine and there we established our home, our Temple, and our great culture, pursuant to the covenant between G-d and Abraham.

We gave to the pagan world the Torah, the Commandments, a culture and a civilization that was the basis for all learning, for all great philosophies.

The foundation for social justice is to be found in the religious and (continued on page 4)

social principles given to the Jewish people as directives for their national life.

The supreme principle was that of unity. Our G-d was one G-d; and we were one people, one social organism, bound together by our common heritage and the principle of love and mutual service.

From our laws, customs and ceremonies, the world learned to live. And when the other nations began to torment, attack and persecute us, the world lost its beauty, its righteousness, and its claim to exist. Wars brought other wars, each succeeding one more ghastly than the one before. And finally World War II has given birth to a new weapon, that, if ever used in a new conflict, will wipe off the face of the earth all humanity.

There is only one antidote against such a holocaust. Give our people back the land which the Torah speaks of as our heritage so that we may rebuild our Temple and worship Him in the manner prescribed in his Holy teachings, that the G-d of Israel and of all peoples shall dwell among us and bless us with a final peace for all time, happiness within our ranks and with brotherly love towards all nations on the face of the earth.

A REVIEW OF OUR WAR EFFORT

Shortly after Pearl Harbor, our War Effort Committee went to work under the capable leadership of our comptroller, treasurer and financial genius, Jack Slove. Our first concern was to help in the financing of the war. Thus we participated actively in every War Bond drive and succeeded in selling about \$75,000. worth to date. We expect to reach our goal of \$100,000. during the current Victory Loan Drive, set for the period from October 29th to December 8th.

Last December, we held a special War Bond Rally at our auditorium. At that occasion alone, we sold over \$25,000. worth of bonds, as a result of which our organization received a citation from the U.S. Treasury Dept. and a Navy plane was named in our honor.

Our next effort was concerned with the welfare of our members inducted into the armed forces. A handsome honor will was dedicated and dignifies our witing rooms as an everlasting tribute to those "whom so proudly we hail". Every Purim and Chanukkah our boys receive gift packages, and in between, letters, books and other reading matter are sent regularly.

Finally we gave blood! Of those patriotic members (listed on a special honor roll in our meeting rooms) who gave, gave and gave again and again, when the going was tough, we are indeed proud for their share in our great victory. Honorable mention especially to our "five pint" men - Bill Posner and Boris Stern.

We can truly say that Young Israel of Parkchester did its share for the victory that is ours. By contribution to the armed forces, in civilian defense, Red Cross, War Fund Drives and all other efforts, our members were always ready to answer the call.

In announcing the new Victory Loan Drive which will be the last of the big public drives, Secretary of the Treasury Vinson said:

"The aftermath of war, however, carries grave responsibilities that must be met. A substantial army and navy must be maintained until order is restored throughout the world. The cost of contract settlements, bringing our forces home, their mustering-out pay, hospitalization, care and rehabilitation will be great and will require large sums for which we must plan now."

A special Series E bond of \$200. denomination is being issued at \$150. in memory of President Roosevelt. What more fitting tribute can be paid to our beloved champion of humanity!
