


OUR JEWISH COMMUNITY

B'NAI B'RITH

(This is the first in a series of articles on leading Jewish organizations in Parchester vitally contributing to Jewish life today. Ed.)

Evolution from its position as a substitute for the synagogue to its present position of leadership in American Jewish life has marked B'nai B'rith's voyage of a century across the American scene.

B'nai B'rith originated in 1843 at the time of German-Jewish Reformism's adolescence in the United States. Henry Monsky, the late President of the Supreme Lodge of B'nai B'rith, wrote in "This Is B'nai B'rith" that B'nai B'rith was "created as an agency for the unification and cultural development of the American Jewish community". In the same volume, its editor Bernard Postal speaking of B'nai B'rith's origin said, "Organized Jewish life -- centered around the synagogue Synagogues increased in numbers but more because of the spirit of competition and lack of leadership than out of any real need. The times called for a new type of organization, and it was some of the younger and better educated among the German newcomers who did something about it.

At its inception, its membership consisting almost exclusively of Reformistindoctrinated German Jews, B'nai B'rith's main activities tended to philanthropy. The arrival of Eastern European Jewish immigrants in the second half of the 19th century brought about a gradual change in the character of B'nai B'rith membership with a resulting modification of B'nai B'rith's original aims and a broadening of its spheres of activity.

By 1940, with a membership of 175,000, B'nai B'rith's program embraced projects for the furtherance of youth welfare, Americanism, defense of Jewish rights, social and community service, education, interfaith understanding and philanthropy. In many of our smaller American communities today, B'nai B'rith leaders are synagogue leaders and B'nai B'rith's pres-

ent attitude on Jewish education is summarized by Abram L. Sachar, the National director of the Hillel Foundations, as follows: "A welldeveloped program of Jewish education, a luxury in the past, has now become a prime necessity for Jewish survival." During the war, B'nai B'rith added another feather to its cap when, in a nationwide campaign, it borrowed 137 Sifrei Torah from synagogues and temples which were loaned for use in Jewish religious services at Army camps, Naval stations and air bases in the United States and its territories.

Among B'nai B'rith's manifold important activities, the work of its Anti-Defamation League and its Hillel Foundations stand out. The League's experience in cleaning up defamation of the Jew in vaudeville and in combating biased advertising, prepared it for the war on American anti-Semitism generated by the economic depression and the advent of Hiterlism in 1933. At present, the League is actively fighting axis-inspired war canards again the Jew.

The first Hillel Foundation was founded in 1923 at the University of Illinois under the sponsorship of B'nai B'rith. This unique campus institution was inspired by a wise Christian educator, Dr. Edward Chauncey Baldwin, who revolted at the thought that his Jewish students at Illinois knew so little about their own Bible, and by a selfsacrificing young rabbi, Benjamin Frankel. This first Hillel unit, the precursor of many others, served as a cultural, religious and social welfare station for Jewish students at Illinois. Its program was designed to inspire Jewish college men and women with an awakened interest in and respect for Jewish culture and traditions and to prepare them to. take their proper place in community leadership. Since them, at 70 colleges and universities, thousands of students have been brought within the sphere of Hillel influence with ultimate benefits to Jewry, Judaism and America. J. S.

SHYLOCK AND HIS DAUGHTER

- A Review of the Play -

The difference between villainy and martyrdom can be just a matter of perspective. From the standpoint of "Shylock and His Daughter," which Maurice Schwartz offers at his Yiddish Art Theatre on lower Second Avenue, Shakespeare's harsh portrait of the villian in "The Merchant of Venice" takes on dimensions of humanity and sympathy. What the new Yiddish play has done is to give Shylock something of the goading provocation that Shake-speare gave to Hamlet. As enacted by Mr. Schwartz in one of his most eloquent portrayals, the character achieves a real measure of tragic stature.

In motivating Shylock, the play exploits to the hilt the documentation of sixteenth-century Venice that buttressed the Palestinian novel by Ari Ibn-Zahav, on which it is based. It is against a background of anti-Jewish persecution and terrorism that Shylock's bitterness is multiplied by his oppres sors' treachery. For in the current version, he is duped into lending 3,000 ducats toward the courtship and conversion of his daughter by his enemies. It has the makings of a successful season for Mr. Schwartz and his troupe of vigorous actors. With the uninhibited style of the Yiddish stage, the players seem perfectly at home in Shakespearean costumes. They deserve to prosper in a play that has dignity, substance and the best of intentions.
