



NEW YEAR'S RESOLUTION - PAY YOUR ARREARS TO YOUNG ISRAEL

THE FOUR SPECIES OF SUCCOTH

"And ye shall take unto yourself on the first day the fruit of goodly trees, branches of palm trees, and boughs of thick trees, and willow of the brook, and ye shall rejoice before the Lord your G-d seven days" (Lev. XXIII,40).

The Torah tells us to celebrate this beautiful holiday and to mark our rejoicing with the four different "minim." Each one of these "minim" has its own special significance and, according to the Law we may pronounce the blessing to the Almighty only while holding all of them together.

Symbolically these four "minim" are reminders to us that we as a people must endure in Unison all of the agonies, trials and oppressions of the Goluth, -- only in Unison are we able to withstand the slurs and the slanders which time and again are hurled against our people.

It is well to think of the four species which the Bible have enjoined upon us and has instructed us to use in constituting the four "minim."

The Esrog is a fruit which gives food and sustenance to man and at the same time lavishes upon him the gift of its fragrant aroma. The "Lulov," on the other hand, has not this fragrance, but is a thing of beauty to which man's artistic sense responds with pleasure and enjoyment. The "Hodos" like the Esrog is marked by its fragrance but is not a food giving substance. The "Arovoh," the fourth of the "minim" has neither fragrance, taste, nor nourishment; and yet the "Arovoh" is an essential and integral part of the "minim" since it represents the force and the power which together with the branches of the "Lulov" and "Hodos" makes it possible for these two to serve the purposes for which they are intended.

With the Commencement of Rosh Hashonah 1948, Young Israel of Parkchester begins its eighth year of activity in the Community. We have finally purchased a parcel of land upon which, with G-d's help and your support, we hope to erect a Young Israel Center. This land situated on Virginia Avenue near Wood Avenue is really in the heart of Parkchester and is thus located conveniently for all inhabitants of the Community.

It would be the height of naiveté on our part if we stated a specific date by which we could begin to build our center. With conditions as they are today and our general lack of funds we can give no such promise.

Our hopes, however, can reach a point of realization sooner if we have the wholehearted support and cooperation of our members and friends. We mean not only financial support but support by their active work and participation in our activities.

The interest of our friends has convinced us of the need for a Young Israel Center. They have convinced us of the need for a center where they could gather together for expression of their religious and spiritual feelings along Orthodox lines. We must keep faith with these people and with ourselves.

(4) The Synagogue ushers do their job voluntarily and devotedly. Please cooperate with them by respecting their wishes.
