Julie Horowitz, of blessed memory

There are those in this world who live a life of loneliness; who at some moment in their lives strayed from the mainstream of human commerce, and thenceforth followed a path distant from the world around them. Others in our lives live out of their years in mediocrity. Whether by choice or necessity, they serve their time without intruding into the lives of their contemporaries. Their image is beclouded and shapeless, bereft of identity, and in no way distinguishable, one from the other.

Julie Horowitz was shaped from a different mold. G-d touched his life early in his years. Julie's impact upon the passing scene was positive, dynamic and forceful. Julie had identity, substance, a charismatic magnetism, generating warmth and understanding. He loved people. He had that mark of greatness about him; and those who touched his path were enriched by their experience. To him the Young Israel movement was the breath of life. To get involved was his creed, and the spark that gave meaning to his life.

He was possessed with that magic that transferred his enthusiasm, his deep religiosity, his profound philosophic learnings towards traditional Orthodoxy to those around him. It was Julie Horowitz who changed my life from passivity to active participation and strong feeling for young Israel. He scoffed at protests of inability and lack of knowledge. He believed that sincerity was what ruled, and should be the motivation for one's deeds. If you were sincere, he said, none could scoff at your desire to change. Julie was deeply religious in thought, in deed, and in practice. To him, prayer without devotion was like a body without a soul.

He loved children, and he devoted his years to the young of our synagogue. He knew that Young Israel movement was rooted in the young, and that the perpetuation of Orthodoxy depended on them. He spent his time coaching them, with his infinite patience and understanding. And oftentimes, on Youth Shabbos, or on Bar Mitzvahs, he could be seen standing by, giving signs of encouragement, his eyes shining with pride at the accomplishment of his pupils. How grateful are we to Julie for sharing his knowledge with us; a sign of greatness in itself.

Julie was our liaison with the National Council of Young Israel, and became an active exponent in both chapter and parent organization. He was a past president of Young Israel of Parkchester, and was a member of many of our committees. His keen mind had that analytical quality enabling him to wade through a maze of perplexities and complexities, and emerge with the nub of the problem and a solution for it. His wise counsel was sought by all, and the knowledge that Julie Horowitz had "joined the team" would be a comfort and a relief. He pioneered and persevered and gave the necessary impetus to our synagogue in being the first to donate a sum of money to help the Young Israel of Rishon Le Zion become revitalized and a force in Orthodoxy in Israel.

I shall always remember Julie sitting at the feet of our Rabbi Schwartz, in chul, Saturday afternoons, listening as the Rabbi read from the Talmud, interpreting the intricate philosophic passages and offering a running commentary. I shall always remember Julie with his effortless ease in conducting Shabbos services. I shall remember Julie with his weary smile and his endless energy. I shall always remember Julie with his words of encouragement. I shall always think of him as a leader, and of his *(Continued on Page 3)*
