From The President

The Reverend Daniel Berrigan, in an address before a meeting of the Association of Arab University Graduates in Washington, D.C., on October 19th, 1973, poured his wrath on Israel, which he termed "a criminal Jewish Community", for a solid hour and found it necessary, incredibly, to say of himself, "I am a Jew." He was convinced that such identification would give him license for calumny.

UN Resolution 242 of November, 1967, called for "a just settlement of the refugee problem." Now that the UN Assembly has invited the international terrorists, murderers and highjackers ostensibly for bringing peace to the Middle East, this august body cannot even claim, unlike Berrigan, that its motives are pure and directed toward the purpose for which it was created. The advertised purpose of the PLO, on the other hand, is the destruction of Israel.

The PLO is interested in the ultimate and piecemeal liquidation of both Israel and Jordan. Palestine, which was the southern part of Syria as far back as the fifth century B.C. and so called till the Balfour Declaration expanded the area, would not be relinquished for long by modern Syria, should a new partition be contemplated. Should the Gaza Strip, and possibly the Sinai also, be part of the geopolitical shuffling then Egypt would be a contender for the spoils. Should the United Nations, because of its invitation to the PLO, eliminate Israel from the area, which is inconceivable to every Jew, and establish a new Arab entity, it could then only succeed in creating an inter-Arab struggle for power which, with their oil billions, could make

The experiences in life are very few to match the moments of high emotionalism awakened by the mystic chants of Bernie Horowitz, intoning the mysteries of the Shochris and Musaf services. The sheer magic of Kelly Winkler's chant, the spell cast by Phil Haiman, or the musical interpretations of Sid Sussman, all add to the treasure and the charm of the Shabbos morning at Young Israel.
