From The President

I would like to take this opportunity to bring you up to date on some of the activities of our parent organization, The National Council of Young Israel (NCYI).

1. NURSING HOMES — NCYI now owns and operates The Shalom Nursing Home in Mt. Vernon, N.Y. and the Portchester Nursing Home in Portchester, N.Y. These homes are strictly Kosher and feature a full program of religious and educational activities. Each of the homes has a capacity of over 200. In order to qualify for Medicaid payments the homes are non-sectarian and open to all.

In these days, when well-publicized scandals have given nursing homes a bad name, it took courage for NCYI to enter the field. In fact, NCYI entered the nursing home business at the request of the State of New York and has consistently received the highest ratings from the State during the 17 months since the Shalom Nursing Home opened its doors.

Anyone who needs additional information concerning admission to one of these facilities should not hesitate to get in touch with me.

2. SOVIET JEWRY — As a national organization, NCYI is a constituent member of the National Con-

ference on Soviet Jewry (NCSJ) and is represented on the executive board of NCSJ by Rabbi David Hill, one of our Honorary National Presidents. Rabbi Hill reports regularly on problems and progress with regard to all aspects of Soviet Jewry. Rabbi Hill recently reported on a special Absorption Seminar which was held in Israel in February, whose purpose was to analyze the problems of the Soviet immigrant in Israel. The seminar was part of a continuing effort to coordinate the efforts of the appropriate ministries in Israel with those of the NCSJ. Unbelievably, the original seminar agenda did not include any items relating to religious training and religious education for these Soviet immigrants. It was largely through the representation of Rabbi Hill, who gathered statistics and lined up speakers, that this important aspect of the resettlement of Soviet Jews in Israel was added to the agenda.

Rabbi Hill reported that Brooklyn District Attorney Eugene Gold, national cochairman of NCSJ, also spoke very eloquently at the seminar. One of the positive outcomes was an agreement that the problems of the Soviet immigrant belong to world Jewry and not only to the Israeli authorities. The participants also agreed that the religious identity of the immigrants should be stressed.

I had planned to cover several other activities of NCYI but space limitations require me to stop. I hope to continue in a future column.

Mazel Tov to Rabbi Schwartz for his well-deserved honor at the dinner of the Eretz Israel Committee on April 24th in-recognition of his efforts on behalf of Young Israel or Rishon L'Zion. This recognition was long overdue.
