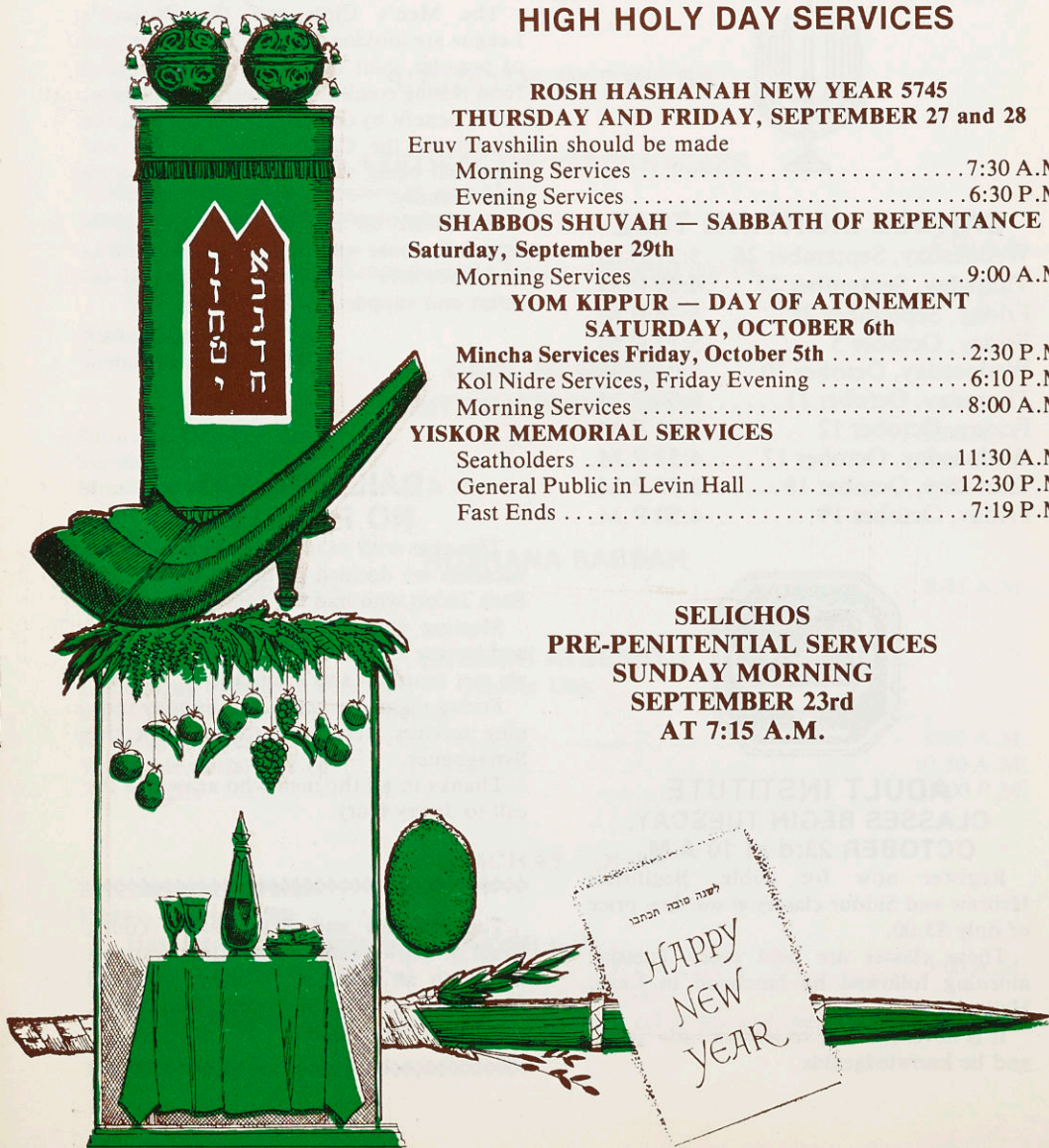

HIGH HOLY DAY LAWS AND CUSTOMS

The Eve of Rosh Hashonah Hatorath Nedarim

After the morning services, cancellation of vows is performed so that one may approach the Divine Judgment with a clear conscience. The cancellation refers to vows of religious nature only, while those of civil nature obviously fall under the jurisdiction of the law and mutual agreement of men.

It is also customary to devote this last day of the year to study of the Torah, fulfillment of its precepts, repentance and conciliating fellow men.

Rosh Hashonah

Rosh Hashonah, meaning literally the 'head of the year,' is observed the first two days of the seventh month, Tishri, as the Jewish New Year. Nisan is regarded as the first month of the Jewish calendar out of deference to the miraculous event of the exodus from Egypt which occurred during that month. The first of Tishri, however, according to tradition marks the anniversary of the creation of the world, and Rosh Hashonah therefore is thus a proclamation that G-d is King of the universe and Ruler of the lives of men and nations.

Shofar

This is the unique commandment which distinguishes Rosh Hashonah from all other holidays. The shofar on Rosh Hashonah has been interpreted as the summons to spiritual regeneration, to repentance. Maimonides translates the Admonition of the Shofar as follows: "Awake from your slumbers, ye who have fallen asleep in life, and ponder over your deeds. Remember your Creator, and be not of those who miss realities in their pursuit after ephemeral shadows, and waste their years in seeking after vain things which do not profit or deliver. Look well to your souls, and let there be betterment in your acts. Forsake each of you your evil ways and thoughts."

Tashlich

On the first day of Rosh Hashonah it is customary to walk in the afternoon along the banks of a river or the seashore in order to reflect upon the purifying effect which water has on the body, and to be reminded that even as the body is purified by water, so can our souls be purified by repentance and by a sincere appeal to the help and mercy of G-d. An appropriate passage from the prophet Micah (VII:18-20) is recited; and the custom has received its name, Tashlich, from the word which comes at the beginning of the passage, meaning, 'and you shall cast all their sins in the depths of the sea.'

Shabbos Shuvah

The Shabbat between Rosh Hashonah and Yom Kippur is known as Shabbos Shuvah because the Haftarah, taken from Hosea (Chapter XIV) commences with the word 'Shuvah' (meaning 'return') and is an exhortation of Israel to return to G-d.

Yom Kippur

The climax of the ten day penitential period following Rosh Hashonah is reached with Yom Kippur, the Day of Atonement. It is the day when G-d will forgive you to cleanse you that you may be clean from all your sins before the L-rd. (Lev. XVI:30).

The day is observed with the same restrictions as the Sabbath, with the addition of the following: Total abstinence from (1) food and drink (2) washing for pleasure (3) anointing for pleasure (4) wearing of shoes made from leather (5) family relations.

Succos

This festival, occurring from the fifteenth of the twenty-first of Tishri, primarily has historical associations. Before our forefathers entered the Holy Land they dwelt in tents and huts in the wilderness, and yet, because of their sense of G-d's protection, they felt themselves safe from attack by wild Bedouins and beasts of prey. Today this trust is reaffirmed by living in a succah during the holiday. With His protection we are safe in the frail hut; without it, we are in danger in the most modern fortress. Succos in the land of Israel was and is today the harvest festival, a feast of gratitude — that is its second significance.

The Lulav (palm branch), Esrog (citron), Hadas (myrtle) and Aravah (willow) are bound together in one cluster to show us the way of effecting constructive work in the new year. On Rosh Hoshanah Raba, the seventh day of Succos, the entire congregation — bearing the aforementioned cluster — make seven circuits in the synagogue.

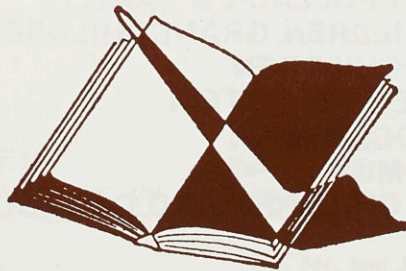
